CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

- 1. The students shall nurture and ensure a dynamic academic, cultural and social atmosphere which will be in accordance to the core values of the institution.
- 2. The students shall treat all other students, faculty members, staff, visitors and any other with due respect, courtesy and sensitivity.
- 3. All students shall practice a decent and formal dress code as instructed by the Institution.
- 4. All students shall maintain discipline in the class and maintain the decorum while dealing with the fellow students, teaching and non teaching staff.
- 5. All students must display their identity cards within the campus and also whenever asked by any authority of the college.
- 6. The students shall act ethically and honestly in the preparation, conduct, submission and publication of academic work, and during all forms of assessment, including formal examinations, and informal tests.
- 7. The students shall strive hard to discharge the duties and targets assigned to them.
- 8. The students should not indulge in any form of ragging within or outside the Campus.
- 9. Smoking is strictly restricted in the campus.
- 10. Students will handle the property of the college with care and will not damage it under any circumstances.
- 11. Students will not discriminate amongst themselves on grounds of caste, creed or religion.
- 12. The students will follow all the revised rules as per the conditions amended by the Institute.
- 13. The students will maintain the dignity of the Institute when they approach other education institutions for any activity conducted on their campus.
- 14. Students are expected to maintain silence in the library and also follow all the mandatory rules of the library.
- 15. Students are advised to follow the practice of yoga and meditation on regular basis for holistic development.
- 16. The cell phones should be kept on silent while in the campus and use of social media should be restricted to educational activities.
- 17. Eating food in the library and the classrooms is not allowed.
- 18. Attending the assembly on a daily basis is a mandatory activity and should be followed by all students.
- 19. All students should participate actively in all the cultural activities of the institute and take lead roles that help them enhance their qualities and skills.
- 20. The Student- teacher should at all times display an urge towards learning and they should be ready to transact the knowledge and skills acquired
- 21. Students are required to maintain personal hygiene on the campus and should follow a decent code of behaviour while talking to students of the opposite gender thus promoting sensitivity.
- 22. Girls and boys should participate in all the educational activities and promote gender equality.
- 23. College is committed to providing equal opportunities to girls and boys to enable them to realise their potential that will help them to enjoy economic security and freedom and make positive contribution to the nation and their community.
- 24. All schedules of the micro- teaching, practice lessons and internship should be complied by the students and should be informed to the Prof. Incharge.

- 25. The students should read instructions sent by the college authorities and follow them duly. The college offers equal opportunities to all genders to participate in the SRC elections and Department-specific activities.
- 26. The student-teachers shall objectively encourage school boys and girls to voice their experiences, concerns and debate the issues to understand each other's perspective. For inclusive learning it is imperative that slow learners do not feel excluded from learning.
- 27. To encourage inclusive value of tolerance, team work, respect for social, cultural, ethnic, language and religious diversity, the student-teachers are required to use gender neutral language, use multiple and diverse examples, avoid stereotyping a group or community.
- 28. Teachers are encouraged to consider gender equality as an inter-disciplinary theme that needs to be discussed and highlighted within the context of the paper/subject they are teaching. This can be done by providing appropriate illustrations and examples.
