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### Education


- Education is the process of learning.

### **Formal Education**

• Formal education arrives in a structured environment whose obvious purpose is teaching students.

• Usually, formal education takes place in a school environment with classrooms of multiple students learning together with a trained, certified teacher of the subject.

• Formal education is the one that works under the framework set by individual boards of education.

### Formal Education...

- Formal education, as the name suggests, is very structured in natures as proper guidelines are laid, and the students are expected to work under these guidelines.
- Education focuses on the development of academic, psychological, spiritual and physical capabilities of a person.
- An uneducated person faces several difficulties in life.

### Formal Education...

• Formal education is normally delivered by trained teachers in a systematic way within a school, college, university or academic or trade skills.

• It is provide under certain set of rules and regulations.

### **PROS**

- Teamwork and social interaction skills get developed.

### **CONS**
