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Educational Objectives


 An objective is a point or an end view of something towards which action is directed.

 It gives direction to the educational programme, that one wants to undertake.

Taxonomy ????

- Taxonomy Derived from two Greek words
- Taxis Arrangement
- Nomas Law or orderly
- Taxonomy Orderly arrangement
- Taxonomy mean Classification (e.g. animals, plants)

Dr. Bloom's taxonomy



1. The Cognitive Domain

It is concerned with knowledge, including the activities of remembering and recalling knowledge, thinking problem solving, creating etc.

Cognitive Domain-Objectives and actions:

Objective level	Student's action
Remembering	To identify, to define, to list out, tabling, to describe, to name.
Comprehension	To translate, to differentiate, to explain, abstract.
Application	To use, to handle, to create, to solve the example, to show, to calculate, to identify.
Analysis	To identify difference, to separate, to convert into sub point, to analyze, to compare, to select.
Synthesis	To integrate, to organize, to conclude, to arrange, to build, to design.
Evaluation	To compare, to explain, to interprete, to conclude, to sum up, to evaluate.

2. The Affective Domain

It is concerned with feeling. The objectives in this domain describe changes in interest, attitudes and values and the development of appreciation and adequate adjustment.

Affective Domain – Objective and actions.

Objective level	Student's action
Attending	To follow, to select, to ask, to attend.
Responding	To read, to help, to answer, to tell, to will, to be sure, to assist, to contribute.
Valuing	To read, to study, to function, to accept, to ask, to share, to involve, to follow.
Organization	To integrate, to synthesis, to listen, to improve, to relate.
Characterization	To behave, to serve, to use, to verify, to confirm, to resolve, integration and attitudes.

3. The Psychomotor Domain

It deals with area in which varied types of muscular skills and co ordinations in mechanical work, physical training and surgery

Psychomotor Domain – Objectives and students actions.

Objective level	Student's action
Imitation	To drill letters, pictures, to handle
	the equipment, to jump, to do
	specific movement.
Manipulation	To handle the equipment for
	experiment, to write, to drive a
	machine, to jump, to swim, to play
	etc.
Precision	To do above mentioned actions
	smoothly and skillfully.
Articulation	Integration of action, to use various
	muscles at a time.
Naturalizations	Effortless and skilled action.

Educational Importance

- It is used for analysis and classification of objectives.
- We can decide the scope of objectives at different level for different subjects
- It is useful while evaluating the student.
- We can evaluate the student beyond the knowledge and comprehension.
- It is the guideline for the teaching learning process
- As we need balanced diet for all round development of the body, similarly balanced learning outcomes in the three domains are necessary for an all round development of an individual.
