Report of Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) on overall institutional performance

Year 2022-23

Introduction:

Tilak college of education is situated in Pune and is affiliated with Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune. The college offers various courses like B.Ed., M.Ed. and Ph.D. in faculty of education. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college has been continuously working on quality improvement and the betterment of the students learning experiences. In order to analyse the strengths and lag areas of the college and scope for further improvement, feedback from students has been received. This report focuses on the feedback of the students on overall institutional performance.

Data collection and analysis:

To receive feedback from all students of the college Google form was created and sent to students. According to -----64----- the responses received from the B.Ed. students in order to arrive at comprehensive results, useful statistical tools like percentage, etc. have been used. For the effective presentation of the data, various types of graphs have been used.

Student satisfaction Survey on overall institutional performance was taken from the B. Ed. students for the year 2022-23. Following parameters were considered for the feedback from student teachers.

1. Infrastructure of Institution
2. Teachers abilities, skills and attributes
3. Usage of innovative Teaching Methodologies
4. Learning Environment
5. Internal Evaluation
6. Support Services



Major observations and action taken:

1. It was noticed that, majority of 80 % of the students have responded that, 70 to 100% syllabus was covered in the class. There is a scope for the teachers to make efforts for completion of the syllabus, as around 20% students have responded that 30 to 70% syllabus is covered.

Action Taken:

2. 92% of students were happy with the academic environment of the college.

Action Taken:

The institution encourages the holistic development of our students through diverse teaching pedagogies. Additionally, a well-stocked library with extensive regarding space has been made available to the students for accessing primary and secondary study material. Moreover, Tilak College of Education ensures the inculcation of extra-academic skills by offering a wide array of extra-curriculars and activities to the students.

3. 93% students were satisfied with the regularity of classes and teachers' preparedness, while only 7% of students felt that classes did not happen regularly in college.

Action Taken:

Timetable for each Department and faculty member are made well in advance to teaching sessions. All faculty and students are expected to follow their designated timetable. They are uploaded on the college what's app group for easy access and proper streamlining of academic processes in the college.

4. 78% of respondents rated the contribution of the ICT (Information and Communications Technology) facilities in Tilak Collge of Education in creating a technologically upgraded pedagogical environment as 'Always Effective' while 22% of respondents have found it 'Fair', 'Satisfactory, and 'Sometimes effective'.

Action Taken:

The institution has taken cognizance of this parameter and these concerns have been shared with the relevant authority for consideration and necessary action to strengthen the ICT infrastructure is already in process.



5. Observation on Open Ended Responses:

- Majority of students demanded more books in library regarding syllabus and competitive exam.
- Majority of the students want more space in library.

Institute is having separate provision in budget for books purchase. In year 2022-23 budget books and journals have purchased as per the demand of students and faculty.
