A strong wind blow. The teak stood firmly. Even when it rained, the teak stood strong by spreading its leaves.




At the same time, the herb bowed low. The teak made fun of the herb.

Moral: A small act of kindness can go a long way.









In the first online session conducted by Dr. Suresh Isave, an orientation session was organized via Zoom meetings. Dr. Isave introduced the students to Activity One and Activity Two, utilizing interactive presentations and discussions similar to an offline setup. He showcased different types of texts and encouraged students to reflect on them using various creative mediums.

After the orientation, Activity One was introduced through Google Classroom. Students were instructed to choose a text of their choice, allowing them the freedom to explore



diverse subjects. They were asked to reflect on the chosen text creatively, creating posters, charts, PowerPoint presentations, cartoons, etc.

Using Google Classroom, students uploaded their creations, and Zoom meetings were scheduled for individual presentations. Each student presented their reflections to the class, replicating the offline experience. Post-presentation, a discussion was facilitated via Zoom, enabling the class to explore the diverse perspectives on the same text.

In the second online session, conducted via Zoom, the focus shifted to group activities. Types of texts and various styles of reflection were discussed to guide the students. Through Google Classroom, students were organized into groups based on mentoring cell assignments. These groups were given the freedom to select a text collectively and prepare a presentation on it.

Students collaborated online, utilizing Google Workspace tools for document sharing and editing. They worked on posters or presentations collaboratively, capturing the essence of their chosen texts. Once the presentations were ready, Zoom meetings were utilized for group presentations.

Following each presentation, Zoom meetings facilitated discussions similar to offline classrooms. The interactive nature of Zoom allowed for a seamless exchange of ideas, questions, and feedback among students, fostering a dynamic learning environment.

The online adaptation of the offline activity using Google Classroom and Zoom meetings proved to be effective in maintaining the essence of the interactive sessions and group activities. The seamless integration of various online tools ensured that the learning objectives were met, and students actively engaged in reflective learning experiences.

He fell down. This was the end of the proud tree. When everything was calm the herb stood straight. He looked around. He saw the proud teak had failen.


The Lion And The Mouse






















Report of TEACHERS' DAY PROGRAMME - 5111 SEPTEMBER 2020







Drama and Art in Education

A report

Course BED 211: Drama and Art in Education: 2 credits (50 marks)

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National Policy of Education 2019

Chapter 15 – Teacher Education

Point=>P.15.1.1: Closure of substandard and dysfunctional teacher education institution

Comments:=> In NPE 2019 regarding point 15.1 there is no clarification in the meaning of dysfunctional teacher education institution. The clear guideline about pre-service teacher training programme should be mentioned.

If any breaches are found they will be shut down:-

All teacher education institutions are following the norms of NCTE $\,$ prescribed for teacher $\,$ education. Only the way of implementation is different as per the availability of resources and local need. So in NPE there should be ,mentioned the clear guideline or give sufficient period to review NHERA provision is good to review the program.

Point=> P-15.2: Moving teacher education into multidisciplinary colleges and university.

- Stand alone teacher education institution cannot build the kind of varied faculty that good teachers needs-
- Comments:- It is not the solution for existing colleges to change .Better way create new programs for teacher preparation or modify existing program. Do not point out the duration of the teacher education program is only one aspect of the weakness of the current teacher education program.
- Problems of stand alone colleges

In the policy view stand alone colleges are not providing good teachers or quality teachers. If it is merged with higher education can we produce only quality teachers? the answer is not predicted because if we compare the higher education colleges and teacher education colleges there is huge difference we have seen in method and implementation and one of the point should be noted that 'Master Teacher' and ' Mentor teacher'.

- Master Teacher could work for undergraduate courses but these courses could be more grounded in actual classroom practice. Mentor teacher can work efficiently for this. Mentor teacher can give their full potential in stand alone colleges because they have freedom for innovations and practices.
- There is no comparison of the contribution of faculties of teacher education and higher education.



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There is a requirement of stand alone colleges especially those have quality and standardized norm based. It will require fundamental rethinking, reforming and restructuring of existing teacher preparation program.

Point=>P.15.2.2 Admission to presence teacher preparation programme

In NPE aptitude test was as conducted by National Testing Agency

Comments => Nowadays teacher education colleges are facing two major problems that student enrollment and student engagement and in between teacher educators are facing challenge of stability of colleges whether it is survive or not and on the other hand how to enroll student and engage them in system.

Not the solution of aptitude test—for admission process .Better way admission process will make decentralized and give freedom to colleges. The colleges will take interview and test for enrollment . CET is not monitoring properly.

Point=>P.15.2.4 Conversion of independent teacher education institution to multidisciplinary institute.

Comments => It is good because multidisciplinary approach open new avenues for teacher education colleges and it helps to develop versatile teacher as expected.

While considering the multidisciplinary approach need to revised curriculum, admission process. Enlarge scope of independent teacher education colleges so they can work efficiently and adopt multidisciplinary approach.

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Comparison with other education system- American and Finland

American education system:

- It offers a rich field of choices for students.
- There is an array of schools, programs and locations that the choices may overwhelm students.
- Grading system
- To gain admission, students need to take the GRE (graduate record examination), certain master's programs require specific tests (LSAT for law school, the GRE or GMAT for business school, and the MCAT for medical school).

Some similarities of Indian and American education

- Well-structured syllabuses and curriculum
- Qualified teachers
- Both Countries have private and public school system
- Free education in Public schools

Major Differences of Indian and American Education system

Education In USA

- Teacher must hold state certification and license to teach.
- 20 -30 students per teacher in a class.
- Sports and extracurricular activities and considered equally important as core subjects.
- Flexible education system.
- The standard of education is not too high. Here curriculums are flexibly designed so that every student passes the high school.
- Maths is an optional subject in US.
- Teachers are important but do not hold the same value as in Indian Education systems

Education In India

- Teacher can start teaching to elementary classes after getting master or bachelor degree. However, they can continue their studies to become the experienced and qualified teacher to teach in higher classes.
- Approx. 50 students in a class per teacher.
- Traditional in Nature. More emphasis on core subjects. Sports and extracurricular activities are optional and do not hold the same importance.
- Education system is rigid.
- The standard of education is high. Here students are prepared to face the upcoming challenges in future.
- Maths is compulsory till 10th standard.
 Teacher receives great respect from condents and parents.

Point of views on NEP-19 (Students)

- 1 Encourage admission to undergraduate courses based on a single examination (mostly on the lines of SAT Scholastic Aptitude Test) as in USA: This would improve the equality in assessment across nation. Reduce stress of 12th. But downside is there that stress of this exam would be there. Also, colleges would have to decide cut-off scores for admission. The NTA needs to be strengthened accordingly to deal with this challenge.
- 2. **Focus on liberal education:** Traditional BA, B.Com, BSc etc to remain. But, emphasis on multidisciplinary education, especially to be ready for fourth industrial revolution i.e. blurring the lines between the physical, digital, and biological spheres.
- 3. Focus on education in STEAM rather than any single stream: Every educational stream should have a component from other streams as well as vocational subjects. So adoption of interdisciplinary education. Allow students to take some credits from other streams.
- 4. Focus on BLA/BLE (bachelor of liberal arts): This is 3/4 years course, with major-minor or double-major option.
- 5. Freedom to decide whether to make BA/BSC 4 years course: If made into 4-year course, then multidisciplinary research, internship, dual majors to be encouraged in 4th year. For PG compulsory to do research, preference for interdisciplinary research.
- 6. Importance of 'seva' or community service: To encourage earning while learning. At least one credit for volunteering in local communities, collaboration with civil society institution, engagement with public social welfare programs. Also NSS/NCC. So college will have to take this and integrate into curriculum.
- 7. Each program should have practical engagement.: Laboratory work, field work, workshops, internships, research projects, involvement in teaching and tutoring. This can also be integrated into the curriculum
- 8. Encourage learning of multiple languages: This will encourage learning of languages.
- 9. Focus on performing arts, visual arts, music and sports: These should be the integral part of the curriculum. There should be separate financial provision for these full-fledged programs and courses.

10. Focus on constitutional values: Democratic spirit, commitment to equality, justice and fairness, social responsibility, etc. Special courses in philosophy, languages should be designed.


- 9. Secondary and higher secondary level may be separated as per the existing structure.
- 10. Para teacher method will not be initiated and Shikshan Sevak Scheme should be stopped.
- 11. The Chairperson and Vice chairperson of Rashtriya Shiksha Aayog Should be the nonpolitical person. (May be retired Justice).
- 12. Various Social Categories should be considered in this Policy.
- 13. The Previous policies of Education should be reviewed.
- 14. One of the language of North India should me made compulsory in the schools of South India and vice versa to avoid language divide between North and South India.
- 15. Assessment of Students should be at 8th and 12th Standards only by the Public Examination Boards.
- 16. Teacher Education should be as per the new structure of School Education.
- 17. Teacher Education Should be in Blended mode.
- 18. All teacher education Institutes should be provided with grants in aid by the Government.
- 19. More Salary will be paid to teachers to attract talent towards teaching profession.
- 20. Teaching Profession Popularization Programme /Campaign should be initiated. (Shikshak Bano Desh ki Tarrakki Karo)
- 21. Initiatives should be taken to attract talent for STEM Education.
- 22. Stipend should be given to the students for their pre-service training.
- 23. Entrance Examination for Admission to Teacher Education Course should be rigorous same as JEE level. Such teachers should be directly appointed in Government Schools on their merit without CTET or other Examinations.
- 24. The **required number of quality teachers** should be prepared through the reputed Teacher Education Institutes.
- 25. Do not give permission to start new Teacher Education Institutes.
- 26. Monitor the existing Teacher Education Institutes for their Quality.
- 27. Indian Education Service Examination Should be initiated to cater the needs and quality of Education in India.
