After that Prof. Jagtap Sir gave a vote of thaks to them.


Prof. Mayuri Mahajan Madam did the anchoring of the closure ceremony and taken a recap of 2 day's conference program.



constructive innovation, which will be finally improve the our wellbeing.



e EduEnergy A six day International faculty development programme was jointly organized by UGC (HRDC) Savitri Bai Phule Pune University, Tilak college of education, School of Education SPPU, The Council for Teacher Education foundation (CTEF) Maharashtra Chapter, India, and EduEnergy, Singapore on "Infusing Problem & Project Based Learning (P2BL) as Envisioned in New Education Policy". The FDP received a lot of positive feedback from faculty members and research scholars from many universities of India. This programme was aimed for Teachers, Faculty members, Researchers, Post-Graduate Students, Anyone interested in infusing Problem & Project Based learning in curriculum design / redesign, delivery, and management. Total 35 participants from the various colleges/institutions/universities of Maharashtra took part in the 6 days online FDP programme. Each session was of 120 minutes and included open questions, answer session. Zoom was the platform used and the session links, feedback links were shared every morning for the day. The registered participants were engaged in a special WhatsApp group and by email. 35 E-certificates were awarded to all registered participants by email. Registration of participants was done on HRDC Pune website. Pre-survey google forms were given to judge the knowledge of participants.

Day 1 Program began with introductory session by Dr. Madhuri Isave, Associate Professor of Tilak College of Education and programme Coordinator of FDP. It was followed by Welcome address by Dr. Radhika Inamdar Principal of Tilak College of Education, Pune. Programme addressed by Prof. K.M. Bhandarakar, National President Council for Teacher Education Foundation (CTEF). Then programme was addressed by chief guest Prof. Sanjeev Sonawane, Pro. Vice Chancellor, SPPU Pune. He emphasized on need of innovative methods and importance and benefits of new education policy implementation. Presentation - Group 1

Topic: New Curricular and Pedagogical structure (5+3+3=4) for the School Education

Group In-charge: Ms. Amruta Apte, S.P.M. Eng. School, Secondary, Pune.

Stage 1 (5 years) - Foundation stage: Age 3 years to 8 years

- * It includes Anganwadi or preschool and class 1 and 2
- * Emphasizes on good behaviour, cleanliness and hygiene, team work and co-operation in learning.
- <u>Problems discussed</u> 1) Properly trained teachers and material is required for teaching which may not be available in rural areas or also in urban areas. 2) No exams till class two. So, no clear idea of child's understanding and knowledge.
- Solution discussed 1) Education can be started with the material available and with the help of experienced teachers till new teachers are trained and material is made available. Somethings like value education, cleanliness, co-operation, team work can be taught at home with the help of parents grandparents who tell stories, children learn through activities at home and through family members' behaviour with each other. Parents need to be given proper orientation regarding new policy and its needs.
- Teachers, parents, school some social workers, govt, NGO'S can work hand in hand for successful implementation of this policy.
- 2) Some informal system of evaluation should be there till class2 to assess students for their knowledge. Govt. can nelp all schools by giving common evaluation pattern. Children should learn in free and play -way method but should be monitored.

Stage 2: (3 years) Preparatory stage - Age : 8 years to 11 years

- * It includes class 3, 4 and 5.
- * Emphasizes on reading, speaking, physical education, art, science, maths etc
- * Exam starts from class Three onwards
- * Activity based teaching learning.

Problem discussed - In new Policy evaluation is 360 of evaluation which includes peer evaluation, self-evaluation and evaluation by school teacher. So proper format and trained teachers required. Also, peer assessment and self-assessment should be appropriate. Should not be biased.

Soultion discussed - Again trained staff is required, students should be given proper training for peer and self-assessment. Some technology apps software can be used for assessments. Exam starts at third grade so proper knowledge of child's prior knowledge should be there. For that child's report card in foundation stage will play important role. It should have all areas assessment properly.

Stage 3: (3 years) Middle Stage - Age:11 years to 14 years

* It includes class 6,7 and 8.

* Emphasizes on Science, maths, arts, social science, humanities and abstract knowledge starts.

* Vocational and computer training is introduced

Problem discussed- Vocational training may not be appropriate as per need and interest of students and need of that area. Also, techno savvy staff required for computer training and also infrastructure and all facilities regarding computer training.

Solution discussed - Vocational training can be selected as per area locally available occupations. Ex - agricultural training, animal husbandry, vegetable vending, growing etc can be taught in rural area. In urban area training in computers, carpentry, cooking, anachene maintenance etc can be taught.

If chosen properly and experts are arranged and field visits are also arranged then it can be successful.

Stage 4: (4years) Secondary Stage - Age: 14 to 18 years

*It includes class 9, 10, 11 and 12

* Emphasizes on multidisciplinary study with greater depth, critical thinking, etc.

Problems discussed - While choosing different subjects and streams students can be confused or misguided also because of family pressure peer pressure or lack of confidence. They may not be able to choose proper stream and combination of different subjects. Also, multiple entry and exit can result in wastage of time.

Solution discussed- Students can be given proper guidance through counselling. School counsellors or even counsellors in communities can help students. School should take help of counsellors and proper aptitude tests also can be conducted. Students can be given proper guidance for

choosing subjects. School, teachers, counsellors, parents should work hand in hand. Parents should be given proper amentation about career and different options available.

<u>Conclusion</u> – New National Education Policy-2020 has many positive aspects and can be extremely useful for preparing young citizens of India. New structure and pattern of schooling and curriculum (5+3+3+4) is definitely useful if accepted and implemented positively.

Presentation - Group 2

Topic: Flexible curriculum - No hard separation of Curricular, Co-Curricular or extra-Curricular areas.

Group In-charge: Ms. Manasi Bhate, S.P.M Eng. School-Secondary, Pune

The points discussed are as follows:

- 1. For bringing flexibility in curriculum student-teacher ratio should be maintained as 30:1 or 25:1. Crowded classes can create problems in implementation.
- 2. Arts like music, dance drama can be very helpful for emotional development of a child, it can be very useful to relieve from stress. Children should pursue any hobby not only for winning the competitions or as future profession but for peace of mind and to come out from stressful situations.
- **3.** Participation of parents in all this process is equally important. Awareness of parents can be done through wookshops.
- *4. Methods like Team teaching should be effectively implemented. e.g., Science+ drawing or maths+ sports, Music + physics can be taught together very effectively. Teamwork of teachers with open mind is essential.
 - 5. School administration should be helpful for such flexibility.
 - **6.** Project based learning is very important. Students should do the projects by their own. Separate period can be given for projects.
 - 7. Apart from syllabus other topics also can be given to the projects. e.g., Collection of old coins where we can teach subjects like History (historical period of coins), chemistry (metals used for their preparation) etc.
 - **8.** Rigid compartments should be removed between the subjects Interdisciplinary approach is needed.
 - **9.** Teachers orientation/ training is must for this change in perspective.
 - 10. Music clubs and art clubs can be prepared in schools.

Topic: Effective Administration and management of Schools through school complexes/clusters

Group In-charge: Ms. Kavita Chandakka 1997. Eng. School, Secondary,

For the implementation of the new currentum (5+3+3+4) the present concept of school needs to be modified as School Cluster or Complex which will be treated as integrated semi-autonomous unit. This will fulfill the requirement of effective administration and management of schools.

Few challenges and solutions:

- 1} Central Managing Council- School Cluster Committee should be formed comprising of all the heads (Secondary along with all lower grade units and vocational units). This Committee will look after following aspects:
- A) Teachers Appointments Hiring and Enaring of teachers can be done, wok-load of teachers can be divided into different school.
- B) Time table: Time table management will be done by the Committee with the help of respective school representatives for better co-ordination.
- C) Curriculum: Proper designing of a bloader based curriculum.
- D) Evaluation: Evaluation method/format to be decided.
- E) Strength: Number of Divisions, Strength per division to be finalized.
- G) Infrastructure: Wide spectrum of infrastructure needs to be made available.
- 2} Teachers' Training: Teacher Training Module (TTM) must be prepared. TTM must be activity based and skill based. These should also include proper teachers training for especially abled students.
- 3} Parents awareness programme: Sessions for parents need to be conducted to make them aware about the challenges in NEP-2020 implementation.
- 4} Vocational Curriculum: Small scale with minimum capital and infrastructure courses can be introduced initially.
- 5} Vocational Laboratory: Vocational laboratory can be set up and students can be involved in monitoring and maintenance. School complex sinking fund can be utilised in case of repairs and maintenance.
- 6} Students of 6 to 8 standard can teach poems, stories, games to preprimary students being a part of project.
- 7} To deal with specially abled children from gifted to slow learner teachers should be provided with proper transing from special teachers.

Topic: The Three Language formula - descation in the Mother tongue/local language

Group In-charge: Gloriya Hancock, S.P.M. Public School, Pune

1) Problem: For special children.

Parents admit their students late to school

Basic learning years are wasted.

Identification of words, reading and writing is missed.

Solution: Parents should be counselled; small groups can be made language wide and accordingly the child can learn with the language which he / she is comfortable with it.

2)Problem: Students coming from different imquistic backgrounds. There is a misconception in the parents, that if the child starts his education in English medium, he will be progressive.

Solution: But now there is no language barrier, parents can be counselled.

3)Problem: What if the teacher is not well versed with the language?

Solution: Small groups can be made according to the understanding of the child.

It all depends upon the institutional management.

Children's liking towards the subject will increase. Grasping power will increase.

Where to take admission concept will be closed.

- * Dropout rate will be reduced due to language barrier.
- * Children will not feel left out.
- * Interest in learning will be more.

Topic: 100% GROSS ENROLMENT RATE DESIGNATION BY 2030 ENSURING UNIVERSAL ACCESS AND RETENTION.

Group In-charge: Sharda Oswal, S.P. M. Mahlic School, Pune

- * The National Education Policy 2020 aims at universalisation of education from Preschool to Secondary level with 100% Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in school education by 2030.
- * Gross Enrolment Ratio is the ratio of the number of enrolments to the total population in that particular age group.
- * Generally, a high GER indicates a high degree of participation.
- * The National Education Policy 2020 will bring 2 crores out of school children back into the main stream through open schooling system.

The reasons for dropping out from School:

- 1.Engagement in domestic activities for girls and economic activities for boys
- 2.Child not interested in studies
- 3. Financial constraints
- 4.School is far off
- 5. Unable to cope up with studies.

Ways to improve the Gross Enrolment Ratio:

- * Good quality infrastructure should be provided.
- * Number of schools at all levels of education should be increased. Schools with hostel facility would benefit the girl students to improve GER.
- * Good quality and well-trained teachers to be appointed.
- * Establishment of School Management Committee to take care of the overall development of the school.
- * Non-formal education systems should be engaged for facilitating education for the drop out group of learners
- * Various opportunities to be provided in order to engage the students and make the teaching-learning process more interesting and cope up with the expected level of learning.

- * A large number of colleges should be opened up in rural areas which will improve accessibility.
- * This will be especially beneficial to girl students who generally do not venture out to long distances.
- * Opening up of colleges near their homes well increase the enrolment in higher education in a big way.
- * Number of scholarships should be increased
- * Spread of higher education institutes especially in rural areas would be an important factor to improve the GER.
- * Functional separate toilets for girls will help in improving the GER.
- * The NEP recommends strengthening of existing schemes and policies which are targeted for such socio-economically disadvantaged groups (example- Schemes for free bicycles for girls or scholarships, Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, Right to Education Act) to tackle dropouts.
- * It also recommends setting up special education zones in areas with significant proportions of such disadvant ned groups.
- * Vocational courses will help to improve the GER.
- * Schools teaching in regional languages should be promoted
- * Counselling facility to be made available
- *Opening up of weekend schools and evening schools
- * Skill based learning for children who do not have a permanent living place
- * Provision of grains instead of cooked food in Mid-Day Meal Programmes

Topic: Equitable and Inclusive Education for a Harmonious Society by giving Opportunities to SEDGs (Social and Economically Disadvantaged Groups)

Group In-charge: Ms. Mukta Kelkar, S.P. M. Public School, Pune

The Education system must aim to benefit India's children so that no child loses any opportunity to learn and excel because of circumstances of birth or background.

SEDGs are broadly categorized based on

- Gender Identities
 (particularly female and transgender individuals)
- Socio-cultural identities (such as SC, ST, OBCs and minorities)
- 3. Geographical Identities (such as students from villages, small towns, and aspirational districts).
- 4. Disabilities (including learning disabilities) and
- 5. Socio-economic conditions (such as migrant communities, loweract ne households, children in vulnerable situations, victims, or children of victims of trafficking, Orphans including child beggars in urban areas, and the urban poor).

Various Policies and Schemes

- 1. Targeted scholarships
- 2. Conditional cash transfers
- 3. Providing bicycles for transport
- 4. Providing grocery items to parents of children of disadvantaged groups

Methods for effective Participation

- 1. Providing bicycles
- 2. Organizing cycling and
- 3. Walking groups for female students
- 4. One to one teachers and tutors
- 5. Peer tutoring
- 6. Appropriate infrastructure
- 7. Suitable technological interventions
- 8. Counsellors and Social Workers

Special Education Zones

- * Certain geographical areas contain significantly larger proportions of SEDGs.

- * Regions of the country with large populations from educationally disadvantaged SEDGs should be declared Special Education Zones (SEZs).
- * Where all schemes and policies are implemented to the maximum.
- * Policy additionally recognizes the critical role that women play in society.
- * Providing quality education to girls is the best way to increase education levels for these SEDGs.

Boarding facilities

- Free boarding facilities will be built-matching the standards of Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas-in school locations
- Special arrangements for safety of girls
- Particularly for students from SED backgrounds

Then he highlights on inclusion of content supporting Indian Tradition in curriculum.


